# SRE “Scripture in Public Schools” in the news

You may have noticed the “Fairness in Religion in Schools” (FIRIS) parent group's anti-SRE media campaign, which commenced on 1 February.

Whilst SRE acknowledges the social fabric upon which we all stand, unfortunately FIRIS does not understand the ramifications of pulling the carpet out from under our society.

- SRE is a strength in public education in our multicultural, multi-faith community.
- Schools are requesting SRE as it is regarded as a valued service to school families.
- SRE Teachers ‘who are believers’ can more effectively foster social cohesion, the Australian School Values, citizenship and counter extremism with the children of their own faith community.
- As such, SRE Teachers ought to be supported and SRE curriculums of moderate faith groups promoted across NSW and, moreover, across Australia, as an effective service to the community.
- Removing SRE from multicultural NSW could adversely affect the integration of faith groups within our communities adding to any social isolation that in turn lends itself to extremism.

I encourage you to write a letter to your local member of parliament to voice the benefits and your personal experiences of the good that SRE does in our school communities.

Wollongong's CCD Director, Jude Hennessy, offered the following reflection upon Justice Kirby who also “had a go” at SRE recently:

*Justice Kirby wrong about ethics classes and enrolment forms*

*I don't agree with much of what former Justice of the High Court Michael Kirby comments on, but generally speaking I would attest that his arguments are well constructed. That is why his opinion piece ‘Schools must be upfront on ethics’ that appeared in The Sydney Morning Herald on March 9 was so disappointing, because the points he made were anything but upfront. The key points he made showed a complete lack of understanding on why Special Education in Ethics (SEE) does not appear as an option on the NSW Public School enrolment form.*

*Some facts about SRE and SEE*

*Offering something that is probably not available is not good practice. I'd be annoyed if I was for example, offered woodwork at school and then was informed, “no sorry, we don't offer woodwork”. My simple response would be, ‘Well why did you offer it to me’?*

*Ethics classes are not available in at least 1600 of the state's 2100 public schools. They are not available in any high schools. Herein lies why Ethics classes (and SRE classes) are not tick options on the enrolment form and were quickly removed after being snuck on without any consultation in 2015. Nevertheless, it is always well publicised and offered when it is available at a local school. Unfortunately, these decisions haven't been appreciated by a small but vocal group of SRE opponents, whose vigorous and ongoing complaining remains quite unreasonable.*

*The media needs to get fair dinkum.*

*To suggest as Justice Kirby does, that SRE is compulsory, is nonsense and disingenuous. Parent choice is the number one priority and families are presented continuously, with all of the SRE and SEE options at a local level, something that cannot be achieved on a state-wide K-12 enrolment form. Moving in and out of classes is a simple and quick process.*

*SRE providers do not regard SEE as the enemy or a threat. SEE teachers are good people offering a valid and valuable alternative to Scripture in a small but, hopefully, growing number of schools. Scripture is not compulsory, nor is Ethics.*

*A recent online survey by The Newcastle Herald, found that around 70% of respondents regarded SRE as a good thing in state schools and wanted it to continue to be available. Interestingly, the survey results were rapidly removed without comment.*

*SRE makes an incredible contribution to Public Education with quality curriculums and trained teachers. It is an asset in our multicultural and multi-faith nation, with options for people of no faith. It is expected that the Government will shortly release the Review on SRE. While there will of course be recommendations for some of the nearly 100 SRE providers across all faiths to make SRE even better, there will also be much to affirm. It remains my hope, perhaps naively, that it might be celebrated, not denigrated by a self-appointed media and academic elite, who have shown themselves to be orchestrating a narrow, mischievous narrative about the wonderful work done by thousands of Catholic Catechists and SRE teachers across faiths and Christian denominations.*

# Catholic School Enrolment Information

## Are you teaching a child in year 5?

Sydney Catholic Schools are now enrolling Year 5 students for secondary school two years before they commence Year 7.

From 2017, Parents/Carers of students in Year 5 are invited to contact their local Catholic Secondary School for enrolment interviews and offers of places.

In the past, the enrolment policy at Sydney Secondary Catholic schools only required parents to enrol their child one year prior to commencing Year 7. It has been increased to two years, to give parents greater assurance of securing a place for their child; to ensure their child's learning needs are met, and to ease the transition from primary to secondary school.

This new two-year time-frame will also create further opportunities for families to build partnerships with their school early and to create a sense of community. Sydney Catholic Secondary Schools support your child's immersion in the Catholic faith and traditions, and enable them to grow as young men and women who will make a difference in the world.

CCD will be asking parishes to place the above information in their parish bulletins so that Catechists may ask public schools if their SRE students can take it home. I realise public schools may view this information as 'poaching' from the public school system but hope that it is taken as it is intended, to enable parents to have the right to make an informed choice for public or Catholic secondary schooling instead of finding out too late to choose the latter.

## GET IN TO A HIGH SCHOOL FRAME OF MIND

Students about to start high school worry most about too much homework, making new friends, being lost and late for class, a survey of more than 1600 students in Years 6 and 7 at Sydney Catholic schools found.

The research was completed in 2012 by Sparks Education founder and transition specialist Jenny Atkinson, a former primary school teacher whose two-hour Get Set for High School workshops have been completed by Year 6 students at St Luke's Catholic Primary Revesby, St Christopher's Catholic Primary Panania and others.

Ten of the 29 survey questions were open-ended, allowing students to explain what they thought about navigating a new and bigger school.

"The main concern Year 7 students had was coping with the amount of homework they were given," Ms Atkinson said. "One third were struggling with the type of homework they were doing but two thirds were struggling with the amount at the end of Term 1.

"The Year 6's were worried about getting lost, how to read a timetable and those types of things."

Among the advice Ms Atkinson gives students is to do boring or unpleasant homework tasks first to get them out

of the way – described as 'Eating the frog' – and ask for help when needed. She said there was more focus on students moving into Kindergarten than from Year 6 to Year 7.

"There is this expectation that because school is already very familiar to them it's not that much of a jump," she said. "It is actually a major jump. It's a very different system and they're expected to be far more independent."



# Tips from the driving seat...

Being a SRE teacher brings both challenges and rewards. In the first few years, it is like being on your “P” plates...you are out there and doing it but are still learning. (In fact, you will always be learning!) So, while we are on our “P” plates...here are a few tips to help keep you on track.

Be:

**Purposeful** - know what you want to achieve in your lesson. Look at the Learning Outcomes in the Teacher's Manual and think about how you are going to achieve them. Look at the Lesson plan and understand how this will help you to attain your purpose. Think also about what you want to accomplish in terms of relationship building with your students. This might be as simple as learning their names and being confident in using them.

**Prepared** - Write a lesson plan so you know what you are going to do and in what order. Get a feel for how many activities you can fit into the lesson time and make sure that you allow time for prayers at the beginning and end of lessons. Always have an extra activity for students who work quickly.

**Practical** – Take time to think through what will and won't work in your lessons. If you are using technology make sure that you know how to use it and have it set up ready to go. Give your students clear instructions and let them know what is expected of them.

**Positive** – Be excited at the opportunity you have to share your faith with the students. Remember that even when the class does not go smoothly, you have been a presence in these children's lives and have demonstrated God's love to them just by being there.

**Patient** – Be patient with yourself and also with your students. Remind yourself that you are learning and that you are human; some classes will go better than others and each week will help you to learn from that experience. Be patient with your students as you model the gospel values for them.

**Prayerful** – Start your lesson preparation with a prayer. Start your lesson with a prayer. Prayer is our conversation with God. Enough said!
