From the Director, Robert Haddad

Dear catechists,

I hope this message finds all catechists well and teaching their SRE classes with enthusiasm.



Ethics Update. Ethics has again recently been in the public spotlight due to the efforts of the Rev Fred Nile to link his support for the State Government's public sector wages policy with the scrapping of Ethics classes. While the Sydney CCD still does not support ethics classes we do not believe that the two issues should be linked. Our position remains in favour of exclusively supporting and strengthening SRE wherever possible and ensuring that student numbers attending SRE are maintained and increased.

K-6 Curriculum. The great news continues. K-5 is now totally complete and work has commenced on Year 6. We remain on target for completing the revised K-6 curriculum by mid-November this year.

7-12 Curriculum. Years 7, 8, 9 & 10 are now totally complete. Year 11 has been drafted and is in the process of being edited. The first lessons of Year 12 have also been drafted. The aim is to totally complete Years 7-12 sometime in March 2012.

New Sacramental Programs. Work on the new sacramental programs continues at a steady pace. Reconciliation has been completed and is currently being trialled in over 15 parishes. First Holy Communion has been drafted and edited and is currently with the graphic artist. Work on drafting the first lessons for Confirmation has begun. Congratulations to Denise Humphreys, FEO for the South, for her excellent work on this project.

On-Line Accreditation. Good news. Work has begun on constructing on-line accreditation for remote and isolated catechists across NSW. It is a joint initiative of all NSW dioceses and the work will be based in Wollongong CCD. The aim is to provide accreditation to all catechists teaching SRE up to Level 3 accreditation. It is hoped that Level 1 on-line accreditation will be available from the start of 2012. Thanks should go to Jude Hennessy and his team in Wollongong for agreeing to lead the work with this project.

The Eastern Area candle was launched at the August Coordinator Meeting. Coordinators voted on a suitable motto for the area. *In Faith, Hope, Love We Serve* won by two votes.



The Area Candle is symbolic of the link between parishes. Starting next year, a ceremony will occur at the end of each Area Mass as the coordinator of the hosting parish hands over the Area Candle to the next host parish. As shown below, the design on the candle is symbolic. The sun and its rays featured at the top right hand corner represent the sun as it rises. It then falls from the heavens just as the Holy Spirit brings gifts and guidance to all catechists. The Cross at the centre represents the love of Christ. The Scripture page at the base of the image depicts the Gospel message of hope. I thank the Benedictine Sisters at Jamberoo for supplying and printing the candle.

Annually, St Clare's College selects and appoints deserving Year 11 students to be Prefects and Captains, in Year 12. I am pleased to report that all appointed members of the 2012 Leadership Team happen to be Year 11 student catechists teaching at Waverley Public School. 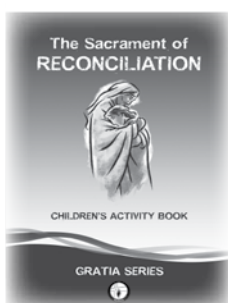

The curriculum writing should be finished early Term 4. Thank you for your patience and perseverance during this time. Year 5 is completed and the combined Sydney, Parramatta and Wollongong writing team is making good progress with Year 6.

The heaviest writing task has been the Sacramental preparation programs. A number of parishes are at present trialling the Reconciliation program and we look forward to their feedback. Next term the First Eucharist Program will be available for trial. Bishop Julian Porteous will be giving more information about these programs at our next catechist gathering.

There will be an advanced accreditation course and a CMC course run at Miranda during Term 4. These are listed on page 6 of this newsletter. I hope you notice that the Term 4 Catechist Gathering date has been changed to Friday 28 October.

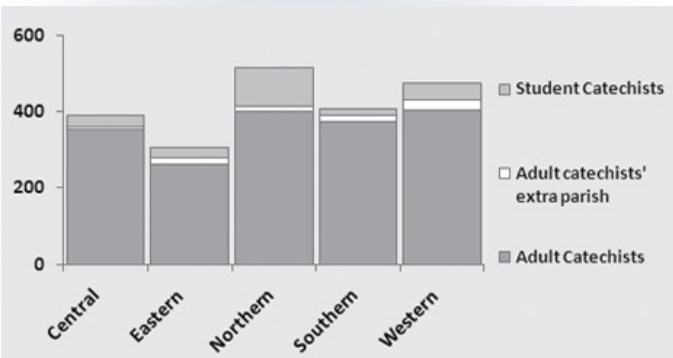

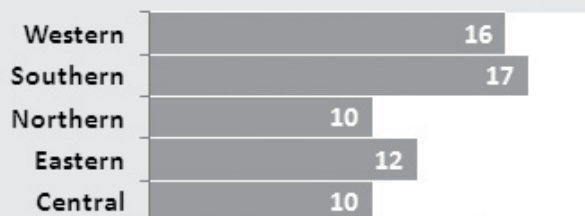

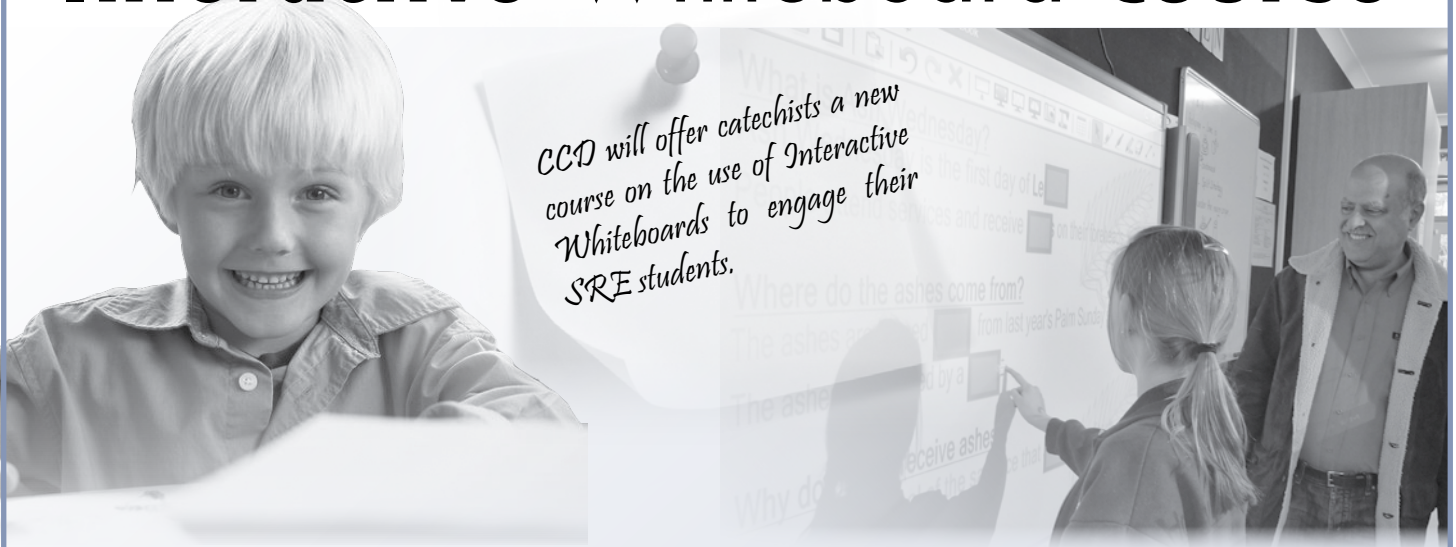

Interactive Whiteboard Course



At first glance, an Interactive Whiteboard (IWB) looks like a normal whiteboard - a rectangular piece of shiny white board in full view at the front of the classroom. An IWB, however, can do much more than normal whiteboards. When used with a projector, computer and speakers, the IWB can assist catechists in delivering the lesson as a powerful hands-on audio visual presentation.

Watch a teacher with a IWB and soon you'll understand why students find their classes more engaging. All eyes are on the screen as words are dragged, colourful photos pop-up and music thrumps. Things happen at the movement of a pen looking stylus or even just a mere finger. The lesson becomes more hands on, audible and memorable.

To deliver the 'magic', the catechist uses a computer connected to the board. The catechist is able to stay at the front the board to operate the computer. There is no need to go back and forth to the computer since the IWB allows full functionality of the attached computer. The catechist can bring up photos, DVD clips, Word documents, web pages, PowerPoint presentations... practically any file the computer can use.

School staff often refer to IWBs by the common brand names. They could be called Smartboards, Panaboard or Promethean boards.

IWBs will soon be a standard item at public schools since the NSW government issued a media release stating its commitment to supply public schools with interactive white boards. The CCD recognises this as a wonderful opportunity for catechists and students to avail of the technology. It thus would like to equip

catechists with knowledge and confidence in using the IWB.

CCD understands how new technology can at times be daunting. Hence, it is developing a new interactive whiteboard course specifically for catechists. CCD is currently researching the best models to purchase with the monies raised from the recent Development Fund raffle. It seeks to purchase and install three units - one at the Polding Centre and two at the regional offices of Smithfield and Miranda.

Staff members Mimi Rivera and Philomena Middeldorp are formulating the interactive training course for catechists which CCD aims to offer by Term 1, 2012. The course will be conducted as two sessions. The first will be an introductory training session. It will look at the basic functionality and use of the interactive boards. Class sizes will be kept small so that time could be allocated for participant hands on. The second course will be in the form of a practical workshop. Participants will learn more tools and techniques. They will develop a resource they can take home and use on the interactive whiteboard in the classroom.

As a longer term project, CCD Wollongong and CCD Sydney are also joining forces to develop the IWB version of the *Christ our Light and Life* curriculum.

Teaching the faith using the interactive white board will open up a whole new dimension. There are many great resources and websites that can be used to enhance SRE teaching. Through this course, CCD offers catechists a further stepping stone in their educational journey with their SRE students.
